Language requirements

Our native language is Danish. However, the teachers and supervisors speak English as well. Exchange students must be able to communicate with patients and teachers in English (equal to a TOEFL score of 550 or level B2, CEFR) and to write assignments in English. It is possible for exchange students who are here for 3 months or longer to follow a Danish language course 3 hours a week. This course takes place in the students' spare time.

Once students have been accepted to study on exchange at University College Copenhagen, Department of Nursing and Nutrition, we will send them formal notification. We will also include details of how students can apply for accommodation.
